Mayor Paula Bowman called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm

Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Approve minutes for August Meetings

- August 2023 Regular Meeting Minutes; Beverley Moser made the motion to approve the minutes, with Jason Coey seconding the motion. All Ayes- no opposed.

Approve Treasurers Report

- August 2023 Reconciliation motioned to approve by Beverly Moser and seconded by Pamela Porter. All Ayes – No Opposed.

Guest Speaker: Mark Rufener from KE McCartney & Associates

- Discuss possible Grants and plan for Storm Drains
- Develop a conceptional plan with cost estimates
 - Look at providing local funds
 - Develop a phased approach
 - Cost to do the estimates will be put in once the estimates are complete
- Pamela Porter showed the spots that are needed by walking the village

- There will be a public bid for contractors with the lowest and best bid.

Old Business:

- Heritage Days Committee
 - Would like to shut down 2 Streets (Short St / North St to Poplar St). Starting October 6th around 6 pm through October 7th.
 - Jason Coey made the motion to close the streets with Martin Spearman seconding the motion. All Ayes Motion passed.
- Officer Report – Deputy Bachelder is requesting that the tree be trimmed that it is a hazard. Jason Coey said he would trim it
 - Nothing Major to report

New Business:

- Ohio First Lady Fran DeWine is asking for donations for the Reading Program.
- Bash/Eclipse coming in April 2024 – Chesterville is one of the spots where you can see the eclipse.
 - Village will be responsible for parking, setting up port-a-potty, and getting law enforcement to help control.
 - Need to work with the School and Fire Department to see if they will allow parking in their lots.
- Buckeye Asphalt Billing
 - The Buckeye Asphalt Billing does not match the Resolution put in place for approval. Invoice was for \$47,075 and does not include South Street.
 - The Village approved complete the work on Miles and Mills street with the estimate for \$17,500.00 carry over from Resolution 2022 – 14; Also include 2023 work for two Options: Option 1 – South Street and Mound Street for Estimate of \$17,127.00 and Option 2 – Walnut Street from Poplar St to 314 to Water Street estimate for \$17,200. Total estimate for 2022 / 2023 Paving \$51,827.00
 - Carl Crisci will work with Buckeye Asphalt on the Invoice.
- Jason Coey had a question about the use of the Drains that was given by the State of Ohio. If he could use them. At this point they would have to be advertised to be put of for sale.

- Zoning Update:
 - Village was contacted to put up a Cell phone tower
 - Zoning does not permit in the Residential Area
 - Zoning would like to know if there would be budget for zoning members to go to a Zoning Training Next Year, will need a estimate of what that would look like.
