Old Business:

Budget Resolution # 2021-01 budget was sent to the council on December 19th.
Mid 2020 sent in to the budget Commission in Mid-July for a total for \$195,438.18
that is broken down by overall General \$127,418.18 and tax collection 21,420.00
with village income tax receipt for \$15,000.00 and is being reduced due to the
pandemic, Village Street Fund from taxes \$17,000.00 and state highway from tax
\$11,000.00 and permissive is \$3600.00. Also shows the expenditures for where
the overall budget dollars will be spent – for instance - \$2400.00 for tree's and

curbs but could also designate part of the general funds from the municipal taxes overall \$27000.00 could use part of this for tree's. This is the budget that is being sent to the budget commission. Did put extra dollars in the repairs for the village house for any immediate needs. Jason Coey made the Motion to accept the budget for 2021 and Second by Pam Porter.

Committee updates:

Trees – \$4000.00 estimate on 2 trees' in the village with only one estimate at this time. Do we need to wait until the April 1st budget to be set? The budget for this could come out of the Tree budget and/or the Municipality budget if needed.

Streets nothing has been done since last meeting just know we have some that need to be repaired. Walnut street the gravel that was put down is now in the grass, probably should have waited but will need someone to push this back in the street and will need to wait until spring before the gravel can be pushed back onto the street.

Gravel for end of Denman for a turnaround: It would be for a 30 X 30 Pad to create a turnaround at Denman Ave. Jacob talked to a contractor to take out the top soil, leveling and hauling of the dirt. It will need approximately 20 to 25 tons of gravel for around \$1000.00. Wait until Spring to do this.

Storm Drains – No update

Will try to get maps for the storm drains for Shawn Rinehart.

Look for any storm drain files or grant opportunities files.

Jerry has some notes on who he spoke to in order to get the cost of the storm drain.

CDGB – No update

Fire Station – still in the process of building structure with preliminaries like the storm drains and getting utilities put in. having a meeting with the owner Mr. Moser on easement.

2-5-10 Committee & Planning Commission

Last year the 2-5-10 and planning commission was withdrawn due to the current Covid situation and not able to meet it is being proposed to move the 2-5-10 Committee and Planning Commission to the Council until further date. There are 3 options being proposed:

- **Option 1** - Re-establish both Planning Commission and 2-5-10 Committee and try to fill both with members.
- **Option 2** - Re-Establish the Planning Commission and absorb all of the duties and functions of the Commission and Committee.
- **Option 3** - Have the Council take control of both Commission and Committee functions at the present time until the turmoil and health crisis has gone back to a close to normal state. At that time the Commission and/or Committee could be formed again. All presentations and suggestions would have to be approved by Council anyway that is chosen.

To Sum Up – What is in the current Zoning book the council needs to rewrite the Planning Committee page because of the pandemic and having a hard time meeting that we will need to push this back to next year. Bring any suggestion and make this a standing agenda item.

Council suggests to do **Option 3** is best for now, Council will need to discuss and get the commission pages in order then **Option 2** may be a good Segway for 2022.


