Mayor Paula Bowman called the meeting to order.

- Approve minutes from March 2021 – motion by Pam Porter and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bev Moser – All Ayes – approved.

**Old Business:**

Zoning Inspector will be next month for Denman

- Brent Russell salary when Jane Taylor was Mayor she paid him \$150 to \$200 he would be ok with \$100
  - There is enough \$ to come out of several budget items, however he will need to be a W2 or 1099.
  - Further discussion would be next month

Council Committee Responsibilities Update:

- Mayor would like to get started on doing something for the village like one street and one drain or something.

Chesterville Village Mission Statement: "We strive to provide the best quality of life and environment in which our residents and businesses can thrive."

- In looking at the budget we have some money available, by August we should have around \$8000 available at the moment
- CDBG – Beverly Moser Chair
  - Met with Joe Claus to discuss grants
  - Will be meeting with other folks in future
  - Need to look at hiring a Grant Rider
    - Need to understand what projects we will want to have done and when we need them to have done.
- Village Lights – Cindy Adkins Chair
  - No issues at this time
- Village Trees – Jason Coey – Chair
  - Nothing new, there is an email out to ASPLUNDH.
  - Jason is going to call to see if the first person he called is certified
  - Will work on getting a few more estimates to ensure \$2000 is a good number.
- Village Streets – Don Carr/Jacob Shaw – Co – Chair
  - Don to work with Paula on the Stop Signs
    - Mayor would like to get the Stop Signs in as soon as possible. Tracey spoke to an excavator Young Excavating, but last meeting Don stated he has the tool and could do it. Tracey to email Don to determine if he would like me to contact them and if we need to get ahold of OOPS before putting them in.
  - Jacob sent a list of streets in priority order that needs repaved.
  - Chester Estates is part of the Village and the streets are still considered private. The reason is the Village does not service is due to the roads are not complete. When are the roads to get completed?
  - Issue is that the Village Patrol sits there on the private roads, this is an issue for the Mayor to get with the Sheriff.
- Village Storm Drains/Sewer – Pam Porter – Chair
  - One Estimate for Mt Gilead Plumbing for \$4200 for the Sandusky across from the Village Office.
  - That would be a small grant if we need to be done in the near future.
  - Sink hole in the village by Rosemary's appears to be fixed.

- 106 South Portland St is getting bigger. May need to borrow a Steel Plate to put over the Sink Hole
- ODOT has been contacted and they did not think it was their issue.
- ODOT Update – Clean Storm Drains were blown out and that it could be an ODOT problem
- Roto Rooter charged \$1500 last year to run a camera at the Firehouse. Pam to check on getting estimate for the storm drain items.
- 2 companies coming out for estimates
- Flooding at the Pizza Shop Pam is working with Pattie Roberts on this issue.
- Storm Drain in front of Lisa's Hair Affair is sinking and sidewalks flood
- FEMA
  - Don and Beverly, have you completed this training. Not yet but both are working on it.
- Pantry Box
  - Still looking for a place to put the Pantry Box, there is an issue with liability if injury.
  - Don is going to ask the Library to see if they will take the box.

#### **New Business:**


- Heritage Day – September 11
  - Need Volunteers for Children Activities.
  - Trying to get food trucks for the Masons are not doing the spaghetti dinner and have not heard from the church.
  - Groundkeepers to help with tent set up and trash pickup.
  - Fund Raisers and Sponsors needed for car show and for the DJ.
- Fire Station Update – Ben Lovell
  - Working with the builders on budgetary items and the original cost has gone up due to the COVID prices everything is moving forward
  - Will try to get Ben on the next meeting
  - Invitation to go to the Fire station on April 24 @ 6:30 pm

- Flower Bed
  - Two Estimates from Diane Weideman \$592.80 / \$647.10, the difference is in the type of flowers that will go in.
  - Before the flower bed is put in we need to get the faucet fixed.
  - Suggestion on asking Growing Companions if they could donate any flowers if they could set up a sign in the flower bed.
- Motion to fix the faucet by Jacob Shaw to spend up to \$200 and Jason Coey seconded.
- Fiber Optics
  - A company will be going from Ashland to New Albany and will be going through Chesterville.
  - Send the Spectrum Contract to Andy
- Other New Business
  - Sent RITA information to Don and Beverly for the meeting coming up
  - When it comes time for when the New Fire station is built, will the Old Fire station be up for sale. That is not know at this time, it would be a public sale and there is a requirement that there will be advertising on the property and bids can be refused for any reason deemed proper.
  - Question about what the purpose is for hiring Brent Russell for Zoning Commissioner? Called the County and he is already the County Zoning Commissioner why would we want to pay him if we don't have any money. Reason is because Brent is specific to the County and right now he is not obligated to uphold any specific zoning deemed for Chesterville with priority. If we decide to go to the County Zoning, then we would use County Zoning instead of specific zoning.
