Meeting was called to order by Mayor Paula Bowman at 7:00 pm
Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all

Tree Clean Up after storm

- Copy of SOS Estimate was provided: \$3000.00 (\$4600 if added 172 Portland)
 - Tree Removal
 - Removal of boxelder, hackberry and soft maple between and behind town hall buildings – chip brush, haul wood, grind stumps
 - Grind Hackberry stump and other stump near soft maple
 - Haul grindings to level grade
 - Remove hanger on South Street
 - Remove hanger at 172 Portland (Route 314 South side)
 - If requested tree will be removed for an additional \$1600.00
 - Chip Brush along roads and alleys throughout town
 - Work can be done towards the beginning of week of June 27th
 - Residents will need to move all tree limbs to the curb near the corner
 - Residents needing assistance with tree removal should contact the office
 - Village communication will be sent out
 - Jason Coey will create a Flyer and email Council (See - Exhibit A)

- Put on Chesterville Facebook, Chesterville Events Page and Flyer will be handed out to the residents (Paula and Bruce)
 - Criteria of the branches should not be more than 4 to 6 inches in diameter
 - Need to have a plan for residents that live on Alleys that are one way in with no clear turn around
 - Denman – Rob Heindel stated that He and Frank would allow for the trucks to come up street and turn around in drive
 - West Street – John Lanning
 - Shur Street – John Shutt
 - Rob also stated that Frank would need assistance in cleaning up his yard as he has many trees that are down. Any assistance would be appreciated.
 - Village to have a Community Day to assist with clean up – residents should reach out to the Village Office for assistance.
 - Council Members to assist when requested
 - Paula will reach out to the Band to see if they would be interested in helping
- Carl Crisci made a motion to have SOS perform the tree removal and clean up storm damage with the added 1600.00 for 172 Portland for an estimate of \$4600.00 with Beverly Moser seconding the motion.

Tree Branch Pickup and Removal

SOS Tree Service will be working in the Village of Chesterville during the week of 7/25 to chip and remove branches that were damaged during the storm event on 6/13. They be working on the side streets and removing any hanging limbs that present a potential safety hazard. As part of this effort, they have agreed to chip and remove any branches that have been piled at the edge of the streets within the Village.

This is for branches 8" or less in diameter. They will not be removing any tree debris larger than what can be chipped.

***Please have all tree debris stacked along the side of the street for quick access and removal prior to Monday 7/25.**
